### The Season of Lent

Our liturgical preparation for Easter takes place through three distinct periods or steps. The first was Pre-lent. The second is Lent which is the time between Ash Wednesday and Judica. The final step is Passiontide and Holy Week.

**ASH WEDNESDAY** takes its name from the ceremony of ashes. We begin our journey by mourning for our sins and setting our faces toward Jerusalem. The Sundays are all given Latin names. Those names come from the first word or phrase of the Introit ("entrance" Psalm) assigned for the day.

The first Sunday is called **INVOCABIT**, which means "he will call." It comes from Psalm 91: "He will call upon me and I will answer him." The Gospel is Our Lord's temptation in the desert and the Psalmist gives voice to Our Lord's prayer as He faces Satan in order to deliver us from evil.

The second Sunday is called **REMINISCERE**, which means "remember." It comes from Psalm 25: "Remember, O Lord, Your tender mercies and Your loving-kindnesses." The Gospel is the account of the Canaanite woman's terrible battle with Our Lord for her demon-possessed daughter. The woman holds Our Lord to His Word. She insists that He remember His promises and be the Messiah.

The third Sunday is called **OCULI**, which means "My eyes." It also comes from Psalm 25: "Mine eyes are ever toward the Lord, for He shall pluck my feet out of the net." The Gospel recounts the healing of a deaf and mute man. His eyes were rightly on the Lord.

The fourth Sunday is called **LAETARE**, which means "rejoice." It comes from Isaiah 66: "Rejoice with Jerusalem, and be glad with her; all you who love her." The Gospel is the feeding of the five thousand who had ample cause for rejoicing.

The fifth Sunday, JUDICA, "Judge" from Psalm 43:1, is the beginning of Passiontide.

This season is meant to order our hearts and minds upon not only the terrible cost of Our Lord's gracious sacrifice on our behalf, but also on His willingness to be our Savior and to reconcile us to His Father. So also, the entire season, as even our entire faith and persons, is observed in the sure and certain knowledge of the Resurrection.

#### TRAVELING BACK IN TIME

This is a full-size (according to Bible dimensions) recreation of the Tabernacle and its furnishings, just as they were explained to Moses in the book of Exodus.

You will be ushered out of the ordinary and into God's extraordinary presence to experience a day in the life of a priest as he attends his duties in The Tabernacle. The experience is simple, yet utterly profound, private, and intimate. The Lord's compassion, mercy, and love toward us is shown in every aspect of the tabernacle. His plan for our redemption is revealed, and His desire to lvie among us is evident.

The Opening Day is Friday, May 5<sup>th</sup> and is specifically open for <u>free</u> to all Pastors and their families. Sign up now for the 50-minute tour May 5 so you can share your experience and encourage your congregation members to join us on any day from **May 5<sup>th</sup> through May 14<sup>th</sup>**, **2017.** Everyone will travel through in pairs to avoid distractions of too many people at one time. Each person will wear headphones (or your own ear buds) as a narrator explains the tabernacle and its contents as you proceed on your journey.

The Tabernacle opens to the public at 11:00 each day, so large groups are asked to schedule their time before 11:00 so they can experience the tour together as a group. The cost is \$3.00 per child, and \$5.00 for adults, or a maximum of \$20.00 per immediate family.

#### Cyber Missions, continued

Instead of reaching one person at a time with the Gospel, what if we could reach thousands or even millions at a time? What if people in a city, town or village heard the Gospel and they came together for worship and raised up a pastor from their midst? That's exactly what recently happened. Without even sending a missionary to Switzerland, some people heard the Gospel through one of my podcasts (The God Whisperers <a href="www.godwhisperers.org">www.godwhisperers.org</a>) and are in the process of starting a church! I can't wait to work with these dear saints!

In 1992, .05% of people in the world had access to the internet. By the year 2014, over 40% of people worldwide were connected to the internet. This number increases by 5-8% every Year. By the year 2020, two thirds to three quarters of the people in the world will have access to the internet, and through it, the Gospel.

We need to reach out in over six thousand languages. We can now do this work more efficiently and with less cost than ever before. A willing pastor or theologian with internet access and about \$250 worth of equipment can create online radio and even video content to proclaim Christ and Him crucified in their native tongue.

With several pastors and theologians creating recordings, we will proclaim the Gospel over and over again, creating weekly programs that proclaim Jesus Christ and His grace for sinners. Rebroadcasting these recordings three to five times a day, this content will provide a 24 hour a day internet radio station. It can also be used on AM, FM and Shortwave radio to reach those without the internet.



Out of about fifty five million people who die every year, thirty seven million die without Christ. We are doing something about this tragedy. With the prayers and financial support of hundreds of saints, our ministry together can have an impact on the world for Christ in greater numbers than ever before.

## Did you Know?

One hundred and two years before Martin Luther nailed the 95 Thesis to the Church Door in Wittenberg, Jan Hus (pron. Yan Huss) was burned at the stake for saying many of the same things that Martin Luther said? Luther even identified himself as a Hussite when he debated in Leipzig.

Jan Has was a Bohemian Priest and chancellor of the University in Prague who believed Scripture alone as the authority for the church, Christ alone forgives sins, Communion should be received in both kinds and that the sale of indulgences was against the Christian Faith.
