ANGEL TREE

This year the LWML has selected the Pajama Program as the recipient of our Angel Tree - Gifts from the Heart for Christmas - 2018.

The Pajama Program was created in 2001 and their goal is to provide new pajamas and a new book for infants through teens.

Maria said ..."You mean I can keep these for the rest of my life?"

That was back in 2001, when Genevieve Piturro, Pajama Program's founder, discovered that the children she read to at a local shelter did not have a caring adult to tuck them into bed each night, let alone a pair of warm, comforting pajamas to change into or a storybook to enjoy before the night descended. Instead, the children she saw there were often relegated to sleeping on a cot or futon, two or three together, still wearing their clothes of the day.

As bedtime approaches each night, millions of children in this country have no bed to call their own — let alone pajamas to change into or books to escape into — and so they have no concept of a loving bedtime. The treasured ritual of changing into clean pajamas and tucking in with an enchanting bedtime story are unknown — some of these children, in fact, have never heard of pajamas.

We are inviting our members and friends of our church to share with the children in <u>our local community</u> the gift of one set of <u>new pajamas (top and bottom)</u> and <u>one</u> <u>new book</u> for a child between the ages of <u>6 to 12 years old</u>). Our Angel Tree will be set up in the Narthex and ready for you to select an Angel Tree Tag with the age requirements and you may select either gender (male or female) for your gift.

We ask that the pajamas and book be wrapped together with a ribbon only without any wrapping paper. Please place the pajamas and book under our Angel Tree and MOST IMPORTANTLY, please <u>attach</u> the <u>Angel Tree Gift Tag on the ribbon</u> that is wrapped around your gift!

Call Committee 2018

The Committee

Greeting and blessings to the members of Wheat Ridge Lutheran Church. The Board of Lay Ministry would like to introduce the members of Wheat Ridge Lutheran Church who have agreed to serve on the Call committee. We wish to thank them for their willingness to serve and put forth their time, effort and commitment required of this group during the Call process. The members of the committee include: The Board of Lay Ministry, Joe Broscheit, Charles DuValle and Dan Maag, the presiding Executive Director Brian Echtenkamp and the following church members: Joyce Wonnacott, Eady Broscheit, Brooke Lundin, Sheila Fornall, Brian DeLaet and Ray Bickner.

The process

We ask that the congregation embrace a commitment to new leadership and a new future. Mindful that through the Call process, God is at work finding this Congregation a new Shepherd to lead us into its God intended future. First, the Committee will review, discuss, and supplement if necessary the most recent Congregational Self Study document (previously completed in 2012) which identifies our expectations and goals as a Congregation and our criteria and needs for our Pastor. This document will be shared with the Rocky Mountain District President/Office and our Northwest Denver Circuit Counselor and is intended to aid them in preparing a list of prospective pastoral candidates to add to our Call list. This Committee will supplement that Call list with names submitted by Congregational members. For those members that have already submitted a candidate's name, we thank you for your input to this process. For others who may have potential candidates in mind, we ask that you formally submit those names and their contact information to any member of the Board of Lay Ministry directly or by email. The names of pastoral candidates have to be submitted to the District Office who will obtain information about the candidate and confirm their eligibility to be placed on the Call list. So that our Committee can work as efficiently as possible, we would ask that names of candidates be turned in no later than July 29, 2018. The District Office will then confirm and present a list of approved Pastoral candidates to the Call committee. Once received, the Call Committee will diligently and expeditiously study the information for each candidate. The Call Committee may choose to contact the candidates to clarify or add to information received from the District President/Office. After evaluations, discussions, and prayer, the Call Committee will prioritize the candidates that best meet the needs of Wheat Ridge Lutheran Church and prepare a briefing on the suggested candidate to bring before a Voters Assembly. The Voters will then unanimously determine and confirm this Pastoral candidate for a Call. The committee will work with the District President/Office to fill out the required paper work and Call documents to be sent to the Pastoral candidate. The Pastoral candidate acknowledges receipt of the Call documents and is given a finite period of time to make his decision. The Pastoral candidate accepts or declines the Call. If the Call is declined, the process begins anew whereby the Call Committee would bring the name of another Candidate from our list to the Voters. If the Call is accepted the congregation can begin making arrangements for the arrival and installation of our new Pastor.
