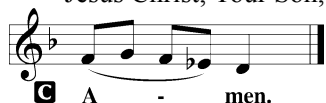
## Collect of the Day

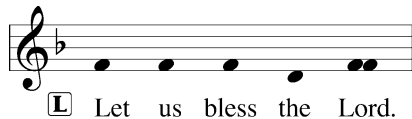
## Collect for Grace

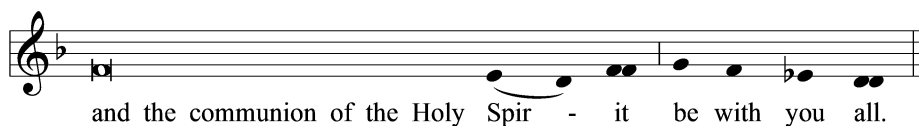
