



Old Testament Malachi 4

The day that is coming shall set them ablaze, says the LORD of hosts, so that it will leave them neither root nor branch. <sup>2</sup>But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness shall rise with healing in its wings. 
**L** Taught by our Lord and trusting His promises, we are bold to pray:


