# From the Pastor

(The Catechism) teaches what every Christian must know. ... Therefore, it is the duty of every father of a family to question and examine his children and servants at least once a week and see what they know or are learning from the catechism. And if they do not know the catechism, he should keep them learning it faithfully."—Martin Luther in his "Short Preface" to the <u>Large Catechism</u>

These are some strong words by Martin Luther; words in which the entire Church falls helplessly short. From the pulpit to the pew, it would appear as if every member within the Church fails to do what is set before us. Now some may say, "But these are only words of a man. Why should we feel guilty for not living up to his standards?" That may be true, and if you can show why these words are false and unchristian then feel free to disregard the rest of this message.

So what is it that we are falling short on? What have I as a pastor neglected to press upon your hearts? What have you as individuals and families neglected to take to heart: The Six Chief Parts of the Catechism. And if you're staring blankly at this page with absolutely no clue as to what I am referring, then I am most certainly talking to you.

Martin Luther lays out for us in a very simple and easy to understand way the meaning behind the foundation of our Biblical faith. He takes the 10 Commandments, the Apostle's Creed, the Lord's Prayer, Baptism, Confession, and the Lord's Supper and he lays forth what they are, what they mean, and how God uses them to strengthen our faith in Him.

Within these 33 short pages we are given the answers to many of the foundational questions of our faith. "You shall have no other gods. *What does this mean?*" "I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth. *What does this mean?*" "Give us this day our daily bread." *What does this mean?*" "What benefits does Baptism give?" "What sins should we confess?" "What is the benefit of this eating and drinking?"

The Catechism is a rich treasure that has sadly gone by the wayside in many Christian homes. Far be it from father and mother to make sure their children are learning the catechism; unfortunately, most parents don't even know it themselves. "That was something I *had* to do in confirmation. But I paid my dues. I don't need to open that book ever again." No matter who you are; each of us has felt like this before.

# What We Believe—Smalcald Articles

# The First Part: The Awe-Inspiring Articles on the Divine Majesty (1-4)

Note: Luther repeats the historic creedal formulas that confess God the Holy Trinity and the two natures in Christ. He concludes by indication how these articles are the historic confession of the Christian Church. When Luther uses the word "catechism" he is not referring to his Small Catechism but to the historic teaching of the faith in the Western Church: the Ten Commandments, the Lord's Prayer, the Apostles' Creed. The Romanists and Lutherans agreed on these points of biblical, orthodox Christianity, so there was no need for Further to elaborate on them. (See also the Apostles', Nicene, and Athanasian Creeds; AC I; SC II: LC II.)

1. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, three distinct persons in one divine essence and nature [Matthew 28:19], are one God, who has created heaven and earth [1 Corinthians 8:6].

2. The Father is begotten of no one; the Son is begotten of the Father [John 1:14] ; the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son [John 15:26].

3. Neither the Father nor the Holy Spirit, but the Son became man [John 1:14].

4. The Son became man in this manner: He was conceived, without the cooperation of man, by the Holy Spirit [:Luke 1:34-35], and was born of the pure, holy Virgin Mary. Afterward, He suffered, died, was buried, descended to hell, rose from the dead [1 Corinthians 15:3-4], ascended to heaven [Acts 1:9-11], will come to judge the quick and the dead, and so on, as the Apostles' and Athanasian Creeds and our children's catechism teach.

Concerning these articles, there is no argument or dispute. Both sides confess them. Therefore, it is not necessary now to discuss them further.

# The Second Part: The Articles That Refer to the Office and Work of Jesus Christ; That IS; Our Redemption

# Article 1: The Chief Article

Note: Agreeing on the content of the historic Christian Creed is one thing. Agreeing on what it means is quite another. Luther launches immediately into the "chief article" of the Christian faith: Christ's saving work can never be given up, or compromised, for the sake of peace and unity in the Church. This teaching

is the very heart of the Gospel itself; therefore, it must be kept pure and free from error and proclaimed bold and thoroughly. Luther returns to this chief article over and over again throughout the rest of the Smalcald Articles, demonstrating how the various errors and abuses in the Church of his day originate from false teaching about justification by grace through faith (See the Apostles', Nicene, and Athanasian Creeds; AC III; SC II; LC II: FC ep VIII and FC SD VIII).

The first and chief article is this:

Jesus Christ, our God and Lord, died for our sins and was raised again for our justification (Romans 4:24-25).

He alone is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world (John 1:29), and God has laid upon Him the iniquities of us all (Isaiah 53:6).

All have sinned and are justified freely, without their own works or merits, by His grace, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, in Hi blood (Romans 3:23-25).

This is necessary to believe. This cannot be otherwise acquired or grasped by any work, law, or merit. Therefore, it is clear and certain that this faith alone justifies us. As St. Paul says: "For we hold that on his justified by faith apart from the works of the law (Romans 3:28)." "That He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus [Romans 3:26]."

Nothing of this article can be yielded or surrendered, even though heaven and earth and everything else falls [Mark 13:31]. "For the there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved." (Acts 4:12) "And with His stripes we are healed." (Isaiah 53:5)

Upon this article everything that we teach and practice depends, in opposition to the pope, the devil, and the whole world. Therefore, we must be certain and not doubt this doctrine. Otherwise, all is lost, and the pope, the devil, and all adversaries win the victory and the right over us.

The Small Catechism: The Sacrament of the Altar

## <u>Martin Luther</u>

## What is the Sacrament of the Altar?

It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and the wine, instituted by Christ Himself for us Christians to eat and to drink.

## Where is this written?

The holy Evangelists Matthew, Mark, Luke, and St. Paul write:

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

- 3. <u>New Light Pole:</u> The new replacement pole for our north parking lot was scheduled for June. Watch the bulletin for the latest updates.
- 4. <u>New Church Sign:</u> There was a glitch with the sign company, Artcraft, and they did not proceed as scheduled with our sign upgrade. Our original sales rep is no longer with them. We are now in contact with one of the company's owners. They reversed their field and are now claiming we need to scrap our current pedestal foundation and replace it with caissons and poles at significant additional cost. I met with a structural engineer on-site on May 28th. He said he has done dozens of these pedestals and will work with us. Watch the bulletins for updates.
- 5. <u>Basketball Equipment:</u> We removed the basketball poles and backboards from the south parking lot. The site looks much cleaner, and we gained four parking spaces.
- 6. <u>Back 40:</u> We are looking for a few good men or women, small boys or girls, or other interested parties to run the lawn tractor twice a month and mow the back forty. We restored the irrigation and will now make the effort to keep the site looking nice. We pruned the low hanging branches to make the work easier. It takes 45 minutes to an hour to mow the area between the ditches and the areas east and south of the parking lot.
- 7. <u>Gardeners Needed!</u> We are looking for volunteers to help keep the church gardens in shape. They really at to the beauty of our property.

A truck comes to collect these boxes and take them to the Orphan Grain Train headquarters in Norfolk, Nebraska. The Colorado West group also pays Gethsemane Lutheran Church \$400.00 a month for the use of two classrooms.
