Around the Word Devotions + the week of June 1-7, 2025

THEME OF THE WEEK: He Ascended to Bless His People

Being the last week of Easter, it's fitting that we find our theme from a line in Paul Gerhardt's Awake My Heart with Gladness (LSB 467:6). The theme of the stanza is that through faith in Jesus He leads us through death, sin, pain, and hell, and finally into the joys of heaven. As stanza 7 puts it, on the gates of heaven is written: "Who there My cross has shared / Finds here a crown prepared; / Who there with Me has died / Shall here be glorified." So says Jesus even now as we bear our cross and follow Him from this life to the next. If we will ascend to where Christ has gone, we can expect the same treatment that He received on His way there. But He gives us His Holy Spirit Who bears witness with our spirits that our passage is safe and certain,

since we have already passed with Jesus through the waters of our Baptism and became His brethren.

SCRIPTURE: John 15:26-16:4 Life-Giving Spirit

Wherever Jesus is preached, wherever He is proclaimed as Lord and God Who takes away the sins of the world by His death and resurrection, wherever this forgiveness is proclaimed and received by faith, there is the work of the Holy Spirit. In the readings for these last few Sundays, all from John 15 and 16, Jesus has been preparing His Church to recognize Him in a new way - through the preaching of the gospel. "But when the Helper comes...He will testify of Me." (vs. 26). Is your conscience burdened by sin and by the crosses of this life? Do you want the comfort and consolation of the Holy Spirit? Then listen to preaching.

Read your scriptures. There the Holy Spirit has been promised to you. *Come, Holy Ghost creator blest! Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 93 The Lord Reigns

Our Lord reigns from the right hand of God, ordering all things in heaven and on earth for our good. Even though the Church may be battered about by the winds and the waves of this world, God is still in control of all things. From His throne, God pronounces trustworthy decrees that cannot be overcome by the chaotic forces that seem to rule the day around us. Through the Word, the Spirit points us to the God Who, by His Word, stills storms, cancels sins, and casts out the power of the devil. Through this Word, God clothes us in His holiness and thus assures us a place in His kingdom forevermore. *Heavenly Father, hide me in the shadow of Your wings, from the wicked who do me violence, Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Acts 2:1-13 With Tongues of Fire

Three theological themes converge in this, the traditional Epistle reading for the Day of Pentecost. Pentecost in the Old Testament was the harvest festival, a thanksgiving to the Lord of the harvest for daily bread (Ex 23:16). In later Judaism it was also celebrated as the day of the giving of the Law on Sinai. And here in Acts 2 Pentecost becomes the day that the Holy Spirit descended in fullest measure, with tongues of fire to preach the Gospel to all nations. So you, O Christian, are part of God's harvest by faith, a recipient of the Word of God from above, and the object of the Spirit's fire every time you behold the mighty works of Christ. *Come, holy Fire, comfort true, Grant us the will Your work to do / And in Your service to abide (LSB 497.3). Amen.* WED

SCRIPTURE: Ezekiel 36:25-27 A New Heart

"Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me." The Lord has sprinkled you with the clean water of Holy Baptism. In that sprinkling, He has washed away all uncleanness and He has taken from you all idols; He alone is your God! In Baptism, the Lord takes your heart of stone and gives you a clean heart, a heart of flesh. And He places His own Spirit within you to guide you all the days of your life. By this washing, you are a new creation, created and redeemed by Jesus. *Lord, thank You for washing me and making me clean, for making me a new creation, redeemed and holy. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: John 17:20-26 Jesus Prays for Us

Christians find great comfort in the prayers of their fellow believers. How much more comfort should we find in the prayers which our Lord Jesus offers for us! He prays that we would have unity, not just with one another but with Him and the Father. He prays that the world would believe that He is the Son of God. He prays finally that we would be with Him where He is and see His glory. All these prayers are answered through the gift of God's Word, by which His Name is made known for our salvation. *Almighty God, grant to Your Church unity of faith, add to the number of those who are being saved, and finally bring us to our heavenly home. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Romans 8:29-39 He Intercedes for Us

The passage provides much comfort for God's children: we have nothing to fear. When we look at our sinful lives, we of course have much to fear—not from the elements, but from He who created the heavens and the earth. The great comfort of this passage is not simply that we have nothing in all creation to fear, but that the Son of God, Who died and was raised by God, intercedes for us in heaven. He ascended to heaven that He might stand as the mediator between the wrath of God and sinful humanity. Tribulation and persecution and famine etc. might come, but they cannot harm us. God's Son intercedes for us. *Forgiving*

Father, we praise You for not looking at our sin, but through Christ Jesus, Who for our sake died and was raised. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 97 The Foundation of God's Throne

God's unfettered glory is hidden from our mortal eyes. Sinners cannot look upon Holy God and live. But, as the psalmist reminds us, God's throne is founded upon righteousness and justice. These things are revealed to us out of the thick darkness and clouds as God reveals to us His true nature and disposition toward us in the Crucified Christ. There, God pours out the just condemnation for our sin and wins for us the only righteousness that can avail before Him.

Thus we can rejoice in God's righteous judgments, for in Christ, we have already passed through the judgment into life. *Heavenly Father, preserve us from the devil, the world, and our sinful nature, so that we may rejoice in Your salvation. Amen.*
