Around the Word Devotions + the week of August 10-16, 2025

THEME OF THE WEEK: Living Orthodoxy: Devotion to the Pure Doctrine of God

The Lord promises to take care of what belongs to Him. He provides shepherds, guards against false teachers, makes us His beloved children in Holy Baptism, forgives our sins, comforts us in the midst of sorrow, promises an eternal victory over the wicked, and continues to serve us through His gifts. All this comes to us who are purchased with His holy and precious blood. And through all of this we are made partakers of eternal life.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 7:15-23 - Bearing Proper Fruit

How can we tell who the false teachers are? Jesus tells us to watch for their fruits. And the primary fruit of any teacher is their teaching, their doctrine. In order to rightly distinguish the false from the true teachers we must have our ears attuned to the scriptures. We cannot look at appearances or how charismatic one is. We cannot look at numbers or popularity, because these can all be deceptive. The only true judge of the teacher is God's Word. And in order to rightly judge the doctrine, the fruit, of the teacher, we must ourselves know true doctrine. And this allows us to not only steer clear of the false teachers, but also to draw near to the godly shepherds. Lord, help me to know Your Word and

rightly distinguish between true and false teachers. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Ps 119, eighth part (HETH v57-64) - Returning to the Lord's Ways and Paths

Pure doctrine is a treasure. It's more precious than gold and more beautiful than jewels. David, and all the saints who have prayed this psalm after him, have vowed to cherish the gift, the gift of the instruction of the law and the comfort of the gospel. When temptations and evil desires tarnish our love for the gift, the Lord's favor and help isn't found merely in the resolve to do better, but in the favor of God, the undeserved favor that comes by promise. By faith in this promise, trusting that God is gracious to us for Christ's sake alone, the Christian's feet are turned once again to the testimonies and his lips praise the Lord for His righteous rules. *Grant me repentance and faith, O Lord, to return me to Your ways and paths of righteousness. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Romans 8:12-17 - Children of the Heavenly Father

The Lord teaches us that we are His children. We have been rescued from slavery to the devil and his house and brought into the service of the Lord and His house. We belong to Him, having been claimed by Him in our Baptism into His Son. By this we are made His children. And being clothed in His Son, our Lord Jesus, this means we are also heirs with the Son. We are inheritors of what belongs to our Father. Just as in this life we receive an earthly inheritance from our earthly fathers, so now we also receive an eternal inheritance from our heavenly Father. We inherit the kingdom of God, righteousness, peace, and immortality, because we are Children of the Heavenly Father. Lord, thank You for adopting me as Your child through Your Son. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Jeremiah 15:19-21 - A Bronze Wall Against the Wicked

In Jeremiah 15:16 the prophet tells us that he ate the Lord's Word, and it was the joy and rejoicing of his heart. Now the Lord sets Jeremiah to prophecy against the wicked in Jerusalem. The Lord's Word will be the sadness and sorrow of the wicked. They will fight against the preaching, but Jeremiah will be like a wall made of bronze, his preaching will withstand every attack. Dear friend, the same is true today. The preaching of the Lord's Word continues, and all the devil's attempts to silence it are doomed to fail. SCRIPTURE: Matthew 7:22-29 - Same House, Different Foundations

Jesus ends His sermon on the mount with the parable of two houses. One was built on a rock-solid foundation. The other was built on sand. Both looked nice, at least for a time, but when the storms came, the rain fell, and the wind blew, one house stood, and the other fell. So it is, Jesus says, with us. The one who hears the words of Jesus and does them has their house built on the rock; they will endure temptation; they will persevere through trouble. They will stand, and, at last, on the judgment day, they will stand on the unmoving promise of the forgiveness of all sins through the cross of Christ. O Lord, stand us up on the bedrock of the Gospel and the confidence of Your Word. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Acts 20:17-38 - Courage to Declare the Whole Council of God

Before going to Jerusalem, Paul calls the Ephesian pastors together and preaches one last sermon to the shepherds of the sheep. He tells them that he is innocent of their blood. Why? He has held back not one shred of Christian doctrine. Every part of God's Word, from the acceptable to the offensive, was held forth without shame. Your pastor must do the same. Wolves are attacking the sheep with human ideas that diminish the severity of the law and the sweetness of the gospel, that jettison the "unreasonable" teachings that comfort consciences and glorify Christ. Pray for your shepherds. Pray that the Lord grant them courage to feed the sheep with the whole council of God. O Lord, grant that my pastors teach me Your Word without fear. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 126 – Weeping Turned to Joy

In this life we will have trouble. In this life we will have sorrow, and pain, and sickness, and even death. These are the things which constantly plague us and follow after us. But in the midst of this weeping and trouble we have the joy of the Lord. We are promised that these things will not last. That they are temporary. And so now, as we endure these things we have joy running alongside them to sustain us until we at last attain the crown of righteousness. Then, we who have gone out weeping will come into the eternal home of the Lord with shouts of joy. Lord, keep me in Your joy in the midst of sorrow, looking to the eternal joy of Your kingdom. Amen.
