Around the Word Devotions + the week of August 17-23, 2025

THEME OF THE WEEK: Faithful Stewardship of Earthly Gifts

The Lord has given us many things in this life. He lavishes us with wealth, various possessions, family, friends, co-workers, etc. These gifts serve two purposes. First, God gives them so we might serve our neighbor. Second, the Lord desires us to spend our money in support of the Gospel's ministry by which men are saved. Above all, the Lord has given into our possession His most wonderful gift, His Word. When the Holy Spirit uses our tithes and offerings to scatter the Seed of the Word widely, we gather neighbors for ourselves in the resurrection. In all

these things, the Lord expects us to be good and faithful stewards of what He gives and to use all things for His glory.

SCRIPTURE: Luke 16:1-9 Unrighteous Wealth / Righteous Neighbors

"Make friends for yourselves by means of unrighteous wealth." It seems so strange of Jesus to say such a thing. After all, we know all too well the warnings concerning the deceitfulness of riches, of worshiping money, of loving money. But we should remember that the Lord uses the things of this world to work for the good of those who love Him. He uses the means of unrighteous wealth to provide for the preaching of the gospel, to ensure His gifts are given, and especially to make sure that more people are brought into His eternal kingdom. He uses our unrighteous wealth to make sure that we will have righteous neighbors

in the resurrection. Lord, grant that I may use what You give to me in the service of Your Word and my neighbor. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: INTRODUCTION to Psalm 119:65-72 (TETH) God's Word Lights Our Path to His Kingdom

God is good, and so His Word is good and trustworthy. The Word of God is a lamp to our feet and light to our path. It teaches us to love Christ Who has given His life to save us from sin, death and the devil. God's Word gives us joy in the midst of woe and hope in this veil of tears. It is more precious than silver and gold. We use it to sanctify every day. Mammon perishes, but the Word of the Lord endures forever. Blessed are those who hear the Word of God and keep it, for they are heirs of the kingdom of God.

Lord, God, always keep us steadfast in Your wholesome Word that is able to make us wise unto salvation, which is in Christ Jesus, our Lord. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: 1 Corinthians 10:6-13 Examples for Us

A house divided cannot stand (Mark 3:25). The same is true of the human heart. We have this idea that we can serve two masters, both the priorities of the world and our heavenly Father. We are tempted to divide our time on Sundays so the kids can play with their traveling sports team, assuming they will catch up on Catechism and church stuff later. It is not that we are shouting that we hate God. It is just hard to fit church into the list of other priorities. Remember Israel. Remember their folly. Their hearts were divided over sexuality, the desire for Egyptian comfort, and for better leaders. Because they devoted themselves to the world and their flesh, they could not enter the promised land. *Unite my heart to fear Your name and forgive me for Christ's sake. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: 1 Chronicles 29:10-13 Everything is God's

David's fantastic prayer is in the context of the offerings brought for the building of the Temple. The people brought money, bronze, silver, gold, and everything that was needed to build it. SCRIPTURE: 2 Timothy 1:3-14 On Guarding the Deposit of the Faith

Raising up young Timothy as his 'vicar,' St. Paul instructed him in great detail on the doctrine of the apostles, using the Old Testament as his required textbook and the New Testament as sermons on the Old. These sacred words, along with their fulfillment in the person and work of Christ, are a sacred deposit that must be guarded with more vigor than the legendary Knights Templar guarded the Holy Chalice from the Last Supper. Thus does your pastor faithfully instruct young and old in Christian doctrine to guard you from false teaching and to guide you to the green pastures of the pure gospel and sacraments. *In faith*,

Lord, let me serve Thee; Tho' persecution, grief, and pain should seek to overwhelm me. Let me a steadfast trust retain (TLH 381.1). Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 139 You Know

This psalm is a prayer to the Creator, Sustainer, and Redeemer of the saints. Knowing God is everywhere and involved in everything can create two distinct reactions depending on the state of one's conscience. If your conscience is bad, troubled by guilt and shame, God's presence is terrifying. He brings judgment and wrath. But if your conscience is good, put at peace by the knowledge of Jesus' sufficient sacrifice and His intercession for us with the Father, then God's presence is comfort and help. God be praised! Through baptism we have inherited the sonship from God, not wrath and destruction. God's presence, because he has been reconciled to us through His Son's blood, only gives joy and peace. *Lead me in the way everlasting! Amen.*
