THEME OF THE WEEK: Humble Love of Brothers in Faith

SCRIPTURE: Luke 14:1-11 A Sabbath Healing

It indeed points out our sin and points us to godly living. But it is nonetheless incapable of saving us. Because of our inability to keep it in its perfection, we cannot thereby attain its promises. Jesus, however, has kept the law for us. And through Him we are healed, every day, but especially on the Sabbath, when we come to the Lord's House and rest in Him and His forgiveness through His Word and His Gifts. *Blessed Lord, bless me each and every day with Your healing through Your Word and Gifts. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119:129-136 (PE) Illuminated Darkness

God's Word is life because Jesus is life. Life for every part of you! Your mind, your eyes, your mouth, your feet, they're all mentioned in this portion of Psalm 119. His Word gives light to darkened minds to give lives of understanding. Mouths are opened to sing His praise and to long for His Word. Feet are steadied to walk safely through the uncertainty and shakiness of this world. Eyes are even given new life, even moved to tears because people do not keep God's Law. *"O God, create in me a clean heart, and teach me the joy of living the new life of righteousness." Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Ephesians 4:1-6 Walking the Way

Every good gift comes from above. God richly and daily provides for all our needs in both body and soul. Therefore, let us come together in the one faith, gathered into the one Body of Christ, and work together as God's instruments for the building up of the whole Body. Let us live together in all humility, gentleness, patience, bearing with one another in love, eagerly maintaining the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace. This is the work of the Spirit in us, in which God calls us to walk by the light of His grace. *O Lord, let us ever walk with Jesus, follow His example pure, and flee a world which would deceive us, and to sin our spirits lure. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: 1 Samuel 2:1-10 The Heavenly Logic of Praise

Hannah is a Christian. She sings, in concert with the Holy Spirit, a hymn that exults in God's righteous works which justify sinners in His sight. Follow the heavenly logic of her song. She confesses that salvation comes from God, calling it "Your salvation." God is holy. Man is sinful. The mighty man who trusts in himself is broken by God's judgment. But "the feeble bind on strength." The song lists opposites like this. To those who think they live, God kills. To those who despair and consider themselves dead, God makes alive. These are God's works of Law and Gospel. These are the words that justify the sinner in His sight. The conclusion asserts that these merciful judgments are for Christ's sake. *Grant me faith to believe this, O Lord. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Mark 2:18-28 The Day of Rest

The Sabbath is a day of rest. Rest for our bodies from toil and labor, and rest for our souls, which abide in the Lord, Who vivifies us by the hearing of His Word and in giving to us His Body and Blood. The Sabbath is less a legality to be weighed in the court of law and more an invitation to repose in the open arms of our Lord. Thanks be to our God Who eagerly invites us to rest in His extended arms, to spend time with Him, learn from Him, and be refreshed by Him. *Gracious Father, as we are pilgrims on this earth, help us to find rest in our heavenly home, both as we receive Your heavenly gifts on the Lord's Day and also at our final hour. Amen.*

FRI

SCRIPTURE: Jude 20-25 Not Left Up to Us

Luther wrote a marvelous prayer which many pastors pray, known as the "sacristy prayer". One of the notes he makes is that "if everything were left up to me I would have ruined it long ago." And this is true for not just pastors called to shepherd the Lord's Church, but also all Christians. If it were left up to us we would be constantly stumbling. We would present ourselves before God with all the blame of our sin. But the Lord keeps us from stumbling into unbelief and He, by His blood, presents us to the Father as being blameless. In Him we are declared righteous, even as He is righteous. *Blessed Lord, keep me from stumbling into unbelief through the forgiveness of sins in Christ. Amen.*

SAT

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 56 Unafraid of Man

"In God I trust; I shall not be afraid. What can man do to me?" We are always tempted to fear the retribution of man. There is temptation to fear our reputation, our property, our families, or our lives being taken from us. We fear the anger of our neighbor or coworker or family member. But David reminds us that our trust, being placed in God, means that we not only do not fear, but that man can, in fact, do nothing to us. The Lord has delivered our soul from death and we will walk before God in the light of life. We will, on the last day, be raised eternally with every good and perfect gift, with death defeated, and with the unending presence of God. *Lord, keep me from the fear of man, and help me ever to put my trust, fear, and love, only in You. Amen.*
