 wrong, and graciously keep me this  
 night. For into Your hands, I  
 commend myself, my body and  
 soul, and all things. Let Your holy  
 angel be with me, that the evil foe  
 may have no power over me. Amen.

**THEME OF THE WEEK: He Suffered the Enmity of Unbelievers**

The Lord promises us that in His Word we have everything we need for faith and a holy life. So we cling to His Word. We cling to it, given to us in our baptism, with His Name placed upon us. We cling to it as it delivers to us Jesus' blood. We cling to it as it gives us promises which are always fulfilled. We cling to it as we confess it before men. We cling to it as it guarantees our salvation in the Means of Grace. And we cling to it even when assaulted by evil and death. So in the end we can confess in the face of it all: "I believe that I shall look upon the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living!"

**SCRIPTURE: John 8: 46-59 Before Abraham, I Was**

Jesus confesses His divinity. Even if modern scholars can't figure it out, the Jews understand what He meant. He claims to be both God and man. If such a claim proved to be true, then the Jews must accept Jesus' claims and teaching. They must confess that He is God, and that He alone can atone for the sins of the world. So also it stands before us this day as well. Jesus stands before us not simply as God and not only as man—but the God-man. He stands before us the only mediator between God and man, the only One through whom salvation comes. He lived and died as God and man for all mankind. *Father, we give You thanks for Christ's suffering and death on our behalf. Amen.*

**SCRIPTURE: Psalm 54 The Prayer of the Betrayed**

The context for this Psalm is 1 Samuel 23:15-29. Saul unjustly sought David's life because he was driven mad with envy. Such are fruits of demonic attack. But as if one enemy wasn't enough, the Ziphites betrayed David's location. Men are weak. Their promises mean little to nothing. Therefore, David didn't cast himself on the mercy of men in the hour of his betrayal but on the constancy of God. Why? The Lord is faithful. David trusts in the Lord Who keeps His promises, even when it looks like everything has turned against him. Just as David's hope was vindicated, so will your hope in Christ. The devil's power over you is ending. Sin's time is running out. Though all you have is the Word, it is enough. *O God, vindicate me by Your might. Amen.*

**SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 9: 11-15 Eternity-Securing Blood**

The sacrifices of the Old Testament were a constant reminder of the sins of the people. Week after week and year after year blood was spilt to forgive the sins of the people. But it was never done. Christ, however, brings His own blood to the altar of the cross, the culmination of all the previous sacrifices, to make a final sacrifice for the sins of all people of all time. That blood purchased us, it redeemed us, from the clutches of the devil who desires our eternal damnation. Because of that blood, we have an eternal redemption, eternal salvation, and an eternal inheritance as God's beloved children. *Lord Jesus Christ, I give You thanks for Your blood, poured out for me, giving me the assurance of everlasting life with You. Amen.*

**SCRIPTURE: Genesis 12:1-3 A Promise in the Loins**

When God promises that "in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed," He is pointing Abram and us to the blessed promise of His Son, our coming Savior, Jesus. The promise of Jesus lies in the loins of Abraham. There, generations down the line, is Jesus, the promised Messiah, the promised seed of the woman who will crush the head of the serpent. From that seed, hundreds of years down the line, all the families of the earth receive the great blessing of forgiveness of sins, life everlasting, and eternal salvation. In Abram, even we are blessed this day and every day, because in Abram lies Jesus. *Lord God, thank You for sending Your Son Jesus to the world as the seed to crush the serpent, and thank You for blessing me through Him. Amen.*

**SCRIPTURE: Matthew 10:32-42 Not Peace But A Sword**

Christ came to earth not to bring earthly peace. He comes to wage a spiritual war and bring eternal peace. This spiritual war will result in earthly conflict. The truths of God that Satan, the world, and our sinful flesh cannot accept will result in division, discord, and strife. **SCRIPTURE: 1 Corinthians 1:21-31 Boast in the Lord**

This lesson gives understanding. Why did the Jews reject Jesus? They wanted signs. But their eyes were never satisfied. When the sign of Jonah was given them, it still wasn't enough. They stumbled. Why did the Greeks reject Jesus? They sought wisdom. But the ultimate revelation of God's glory being displayed through a dying man on a cross was folly to them. Their minds couldn't grasp the simplicity and majesty of God in suffering. Where the eyes and mind fail, the heart succeeds, not because it has a power in itself to catch God, but because it is the organ of faith, filled to the brim by the calling of the Holy Spirit. The cross may be low and despised, dear Christian, but to you it is the power and wisdom of God. *I boast in You, O Lord. Amen.*

**SCRIPTURE: Psalm 27 One Thing**

The cross means pain. The cross means anguish. The cross means death. It does not mean defeat. For you it means redemption, reconciliation with the Father, forgiveness, and eternal life. The cross means Jesus, your Savior and Lord. The devil has arranged himself against you as he arranged himself against Christ in the hour of His passion. Don't be surprised. Are you not a member of Christ's holy body? Though the devil sinks his teeth into you, you lose nothing. With Christ you gain everything. The devil's head is crushed. Your body dies only to be raised. Your tears are shed only to be wiped away. The world fades and the glory of the Lord's House shines with resurrection light. *Grant me to gaze upon Your beauty and inquire in Your temple. Amen.*

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
