THEME OF THE WEEK: He Suffered the Opposition of Hell

The reality of the devil is inescapable during Lent. In the first two weeks of this season we have heard how he tempted our Lord in the wilderness and how one of his demons severely oppressed the daughter of a Canaanite woman. The Scriptures are clear: Satan exists, and he is a liar and murderer from the beginning. But take heart! "For us fights the Valiant One, Whom God Himself elected!" As strong as Satan may be, Jesus Christ is infinitely stronger. He has attacked and overcome the forces of hell. He delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to His blessed kingdom. By the blood of the Lamb and by the Word of our testimony, the devil is conquered, and "the Kingdom ours remaineth."

SUN

SCRIPTURE: Luke 11: 14-28 "The Stronger Man"

The best description of the devil's power is "pomp." It's a farce. It's a show. There's a whole genre of Hollywood films dedicated to the topic of dark spiritual power against which the puny and pathetic Christians are helpless. But it's all an act. Exorcism movies where the demons are next to invincible is hellish wish fulfillment, nothing more. Jesus commands the demons by His Word. There's no contest of strength. He speaks, and they recoil in terror. Why? Their prince, the devil, has been stripped of his armor. God's blood shed on the cross robbed the devil of the only thing he held against us, sin. But now it is washed away. Jesus has reconciled you to God. *I thank You, Lord, for plundering my soul from the devil through Jesus' blood. Amen.*

MON

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 43 "Can It Bring Christ Down from the Cross?"

Our enemies surround us. The culture is against us. It looks like God lost control. Maybe He's punishing us. The psalmist finds shelter at the altar of the Lord. Things look bad. Fine. Can any of it bring Christ down from the cross? Christ was crucified for you. God already punished Him; it is finished. The victory is ours. Why are you cast down? It is still finished. Nobody can take that from you, no matter what they say. If it can't bring Christ down from the cross, the holy hill of Calvary is enough to save us. *Lord Jesus, send out Your Light and Your truth and lead us into the way of peace You won by Your death and resurrection. Amen.*

TUE

SCRIPTURE: Ephesians 5: 1-9 "Imitators of God"

This is about sanctification. Paul's teaching how we remain holy. By faith, our souls are saved. Our bodies are set aside from God's wrath so they may be blessed by the resurrection of the just. Having this faith, we must become, as St. Paul says, "imitators of God." As God has loved you in Christ, offering His own Son as an expiating sacrifice, so also our lives must be offered up in love for our neighbors. Nothing else makes sense. Any other kind of life would be a denial of the mercy of Jesus' cross. Don't be deceived. You can't go back to your old sins. Christian thanksgiving has nothing to do with impurity. Remain with your God's sanctifying Word. Walk as children of light. *Grant me Your Spirit to do those things that You find pleasing. Amen.*

WED

SCRIPTURE: 2 Samuel 22: 1-7 "The Lord is Our Deliverer"

King David must have been some warrior. "Saul has slain his thousands, David his tens of thousands." That is impressive. The military feats of David are legendary. But David does not trust in his strength and ingenuity; He trusts the Lord. David knows that victory is in the Lord's hands. Salvation is the Lord's work. We hear this great humility of faith in his song. "The LORD is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer; the God of my strength, in whom I will trust; My shield and the horn of my salvation, My stronghold and my refuge; My Savior." No doubt David, like you and me, was tempted to trust in his strength and wisdom, but he teaches us a better way, the way of faith. *Lord, we call on You. You are worthy to be praised. So shall we be saved from our enemies. Amen.*

THU

SCRIPTURE: John 8: 42-51 "Children of God"

Even in earthly matters we know it's "like father, like son." How much more so is this true in spiritual matters! If your father is the devil, which is true of all unbelievers, then you will be like him in murder, deceit, blasphemy, and finally death. But through the waters of Holy Baptism you have become beloved children of God. Having Him as your Heavenly Father, therefore, you follow Him in loving Him, loving His Son Jesus also, hearing His Word, and finally possessing eternal life. Almighty God, we give You thanks for claiming us as Your beloved children in Holy Baptism. *Grant us to love You and receive Your Word as truth. Amen.*

FRI

SCRIPTURE: Revelation 2: 1-7 "The Way of Love"

The church at Ephesus was diligent in their works, patiently enduring, refusing to bear with those who persisted in evil, and rigorously upholding the pure teaching of doctrine. Only one thing did the Lord have against them: that in upholding all these, they had not love. They had abandoned the way of Love. They had become a noisy gong, a clanging cymbal. Where love is lacking from any good work and from all pure doctrine, let that person repent and rekindle the Love of Christ! There Christ will freely forgive and restore that person in full love. *O Lord, forgive us for all the times we let love languish and restore us in Your perfect Love. Amen.*

SAT

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 86 "Praise in the Midst of Suffering"

A striking feature of this psalm, and others like it, is that David praises God before he is delivered by Him. Before David prays for salvation from the insolent and ruthless men who rise against him (vv. 14-17), he gives thanks to God and glorifies His Name (vv. 8-13). Through faith in Jesus, we too may be certain of our final heavenly reward, though now we are poor and needy. In this fallen world, the devil still seeks our life, but the Lord helps and comforts us. Therefore, we confidently glorify His name now and forever. *Answer us, O Lord, in the day of our trouble when we call upon You. Amen.*
